

Conflict Minerals Statement

Our Responsibility in the Supply Chain

As a responsible business, Micro Resonant Technologies GmbH is committed to respecting human rights and condemn any form of human rights violations, corruption, and the financing of armed conflicts. A particular focus is placed on the sourcing of so-called conflict minerals: tin (Tin), tantalum (Tantalum), tungsten (Tungsten), and gold (Gold) – collectively referred to as 3TG. These metals are technically indispensable for the electronics industry; however, they partially originate from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or adjacent regions, where their extraction could contribute to the financing of armed groups.

Our Policies and Measures

We fully support the objectives of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (Section 1502) as well as the EU Conflict Minerals Regulation (EU 2017/821). Although Micro Resonant Technologies GmbH does not directly source these minerals from mines, smelters, or refiners (we act as a so-called “downstream company”), we work closely with our suppliers to ensure transparency and traceability within our supply chain.

To ensure this, we rely on the following measures:

Use of the CMRT: We use the industry-standard Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (CMRT) of the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI) to systematically collect information on the origin of 3TG minerals in our components.

Requirements for our suppliers: We expect all our suppliers to conduct their own due diligence, provide us with complete CMRT declarations upon request, and source exclusively from smelters that are certified as “conflict-free” (conformant) through the Responsible Minerals Assurance Process (RMAP) or equivalent programs.

Continuous improvement: If we determine that components contain minerals from non-certified smelters that could finance conflicts, we will, where possible, work with the supplier to restructure the supply chain accordingly or source components from alternative suppliers. **Our current CMRT (Conflict Minerals Reporting Template)**
